- 4. Why was General Edmund Kirby Smith's army located at Knoxville, Tennessee?
- 5. Describe how Generals Smith's and Bragg's armies entered Kentucky, and where they were situated by mid-September 1862?
- 6. Was the invasion of Kentucky the "high water mark" of the Confederacy by mid-September 1862? If so, or if not, why?
